SOVA: the organisation

SOVA, a company limited by guarantee (No 3645143) is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. It is the leading national organisation for voluntary service with offenders, ex-offenders and their families and is also a registered charity (No 1073877). SOVA recruits and trains volunteers from the community to achieve its objects. The SOVA Memorandum and Articles define the roles of its senior personnel and its volunteers; the mechanisms for electing Council, its governing body; the application of its funds; its powers, objects, membership and regulations; as well as the other financial and administrative components necessary to the running of a limited company and registered charity.

The objects for which SOVA is established are to act as a charity:

- a) to promote the rehabilitation and resettlement of persons who are suffering, have suffered
 or are in danger of suffering, a legal restriction on their liberty in any penal establishment or
 any other restriction or penalty under the provisions of any legislation concerning the
 Criminal Justice System, including persons who are or have been subject to Probation
 Orders, drug addicts and alcoholics; and
- b) to promote the welfare of such persons and their families and dependents within the community in such ways as may be wholly charitable; and
- c) to promote the reduction and prevention of crime within the community and the rehabilitation of offenders and persons affected by crime.

Council members are elected by the SOVA Annual General Meeting, with the membership voting on agreed nominees who are seconded by two other SOVA members. In 2002/2003 Council members were:

Organisational structure

In addition to its head office, which is the base of the Chief Executive and the National Director of Operations, SOVA has regional offices in Sheffield (the base of its Deputy Chief Executive) and in Lincoln, and a Welsh national office in Newtown, mid-Wales. SOVA's senior management meet regularly to review the work of individual projects, to co-ordinate the company's work and to discuss development and policy.



Treasurer's Report for the year ended 31 March 2003



I am pleased to report that for the fifth consecutive year we have achieved a positive financial result and an increase in the level of our activities 30% higher than in the previous year. However, margins continue to be tight, allowing for only a minimal addition to our reserves and resulting in our reserves becoming an increasingly smaller proportion of our annual expenditure. Resources now represent 55 days' core costs, but only 9.5 days' total expenditure.

One of the major successes of this last financial year was the successful tender for the largest ever contract awarded by the Prison Service to

the voluntary sector. Work with the Prison Service continues to be an area of expansion and we are pleased to be able to work with them as part of their resettlement strategies.

The fast rate of growth we continue to experience also poses many challenges, not least managing the risks associated with the contract culture that has developed over the last few years. We continue to be cautiously optimistic that the ethos of the Government's Compact with the Voluntary Sector and the valuable work of the Active Communities Unit will, eventually, filter through to the front-line decision makers and their procurement teams.

During this last year we have continued to invest in our infrastructure and, in particular, in Information Technology. We thank the National Probation Directorate for their foresight in facilitating this investment.

The coming year should see a continuation of the expansion of our activities, although at a slower rate than we have seen, as major projects come to the end of their funding programmes. No doubt this will raise new challenges, but we have in place an experienced and innovative management team that is capable of tackling and meeting those challenges.
